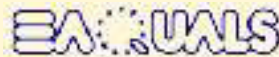
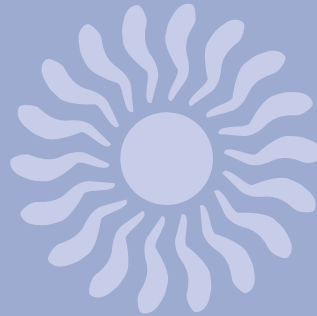

University studies overseas

Each year many thousands of students from many different countries decide to study for a degree at a university in another country. This is most common in English-speaking countries but is now becoming more frequent in countries where other languages are spoken Spain being one of these!

Why study in Spanish and in Spain?

- Spanish is the world's 2nd business language
- Spanish is spoken by over 400 million people
- By 2010 the USA will have over 50 million native speakers of Spanish
- Spain has great ancient and modern universities
- Education at Spanish universities is relatively inexpensive (course fees Euros 500-600 per year)
- A university degree from Spain is a passport to international careers requiring fluency in Spanish

Access to under-graduate degrees

Selectividad is a competitive entry examination for overseas students wanting to enter an undergraduate degree course at Spanish University.

Malaca Instituto prepares students for the "Humanities" side of Selectividad. The examination takes place in June each year (with a repeat in September for those failing first time) and University starts the same October.

The main requirements to take Selectividad are as follows:

- Satisfactory completion of high-school in your country.
- A high level of Spanish (approaching that of DELE Superior)
- Working knowledge of another European language (English, French, German, Italian or Portuguese)
- Subject knowledge in your chosen areas similar to that of a Spanish student
- 18 years of age during the year in which you take Selectividad
- A full student visa to study in Spain

You must choose subjects to study for Selectividad which are accepted as preparatory subjects for the degree you wish to follow.

Malaca Instituto prepares students in:

- Spanish language
- History
- History of Art
- Literature

If you need to study other subject areas we are happy to research other preparatory courses in the Malaga area for those students who are students at Malaca Instituto.

If you pass Selectividad you are guaranteed a place at university in Spain but a university will only consider your application once you have your Selectividad score.

A Spanish University Degree

An undergraduate degree in Spain is called a Licenciatura and generally takes either 4 or 5 years. They are recognised worldwide by inter-governmental agreements. To be one of the relatively few people in your country with a university degree in Spanish is an outstanding job-earning qualification.
